Braille Flag Program Endorsed

In 2004 the American Braille flag was created in Kansas by the son of a now deceased blind WWII veteran. In 2004 Congressman Todd Tiahrt introduced House Bill 4169, The American Braille Flag memorial Act in Congress calling for its installation at Arlington National Cemetery which passed unanimously and a bronze version of the Braille Flag was cast in Wichita was installed at Arlington the following year.

The Department Convention endorsed Kansas Braille
Transcription Institute's card stock reproduction of the flag in
Braille for distribution to schools, nursing homes, sight impaired
veterans and others. the flags are 7.5" by 9.5" and fit in as 8 x 10
frame. Each flag includes a printed Braille description and
Braille alphabet card.
